Please answer as many of the following questions as possible. Remember: this is a survey, not a test, so the questions are genuine questions, i.e. I don't know the answers. You can send me your reply via any electronic means that are convenient (e.g., convert and/or edit the PDF file; or print it out, fill it in by hand, then scan or photograph the completed sheets; etc.).
